40		Restorative Practice Manuals for Classroom Focuses on facilitating conferences, different sorts of conferences - individual, small and medium group, and classroom, and a section on alternative strategies to cope with 'what if' situations that might arise.
41		Restorative Practice Manuals for Schools Covers on whether to conference or not, conference preparation, convening the conference, managing the emotional dynamics, and a 'what if' section to cover irregularities and exceptions.
58		What is Community Justice? Addresses the specific ways of achieving these goals by presenting six case studies of probation programs that represent a practical side of the community justice ideal.
